

Ken Burn's Vietnam Film

Boyle County Public Library, under the leadership of Georgia de Arujo, has been awarded one of the 50 grants offered by the American Library Association, to provide a copy of the documentary, *The Vietnam War*, by Ken Burns. The documentary will be on DVD and will have supporting materials for discussion of the film.

The film and programming kit will help public libraries participate in a national conversation about one of the most divisive and controversial events in American history.

Fall Film Series: Director's Choice

The Friends of the Library Fall Film Series kicked off on Thursday, September 21st at 7:00 p.m. in the Community Room at the Boyle County Public Library.

This eight-week series will be a little different than previous film series, which were usually organized around a film genre, time period, or topic. This fall there will be a variety of films, including a musical, a western, a comedy, a romance, and various dramas. The unifying factor is that each of the films is directed by a director whose works have been the highest rated, according to film critics and film historians. It is interesting to note that two of the films in the series have a Kentucky connection.

The films, which feature well known directors and award-winning actors, will be introduced each evening by Charles Vahlkamp, professor emeritus at Centre College. There is no charge for admission, and free popcorn will be available. 

Free Tech Classes Offered at the Library

The library offers free tech classes every month, throughout the month! Whether you are just starting out or only needing a refresher, anyone is welcome to join.

Not every class is offered each month, so be sure to check to the schedule to see that the classes you are interested in are available. All classes are taught by Caleb Conover of the Boyle County Public Library. Computer Basics - Tuesday, October 3rd at 11:00 am - This class is an introduction to the various parts of a computer; the importance and difference between hardware and software; using a mouse/keyboard; and an overview of how to launch programs.

Staying Safe Online - Thursday, October 5th at 2:00 pm - Join us for a few basic tips on how to protect both your computer and your information as you go online. (Computer and Internet Basics recommended.)

Pinterest for Halloween - Monday, October 9th at 11:00 am - Search for new ideas on hundreds of topics - from arts & crafts to travel & technology. If you already have an account, please bring login information, or create a new account in class! We will specifically discuss how to search for Halloween-themed ideas. (Computer and Internet Basics recommended)

Build a Website: Wordpress - Thursday, October 12th at 2:00 pm - A website may be easier to build than you think. A number of online services offer free web hosting and tools to construct a basic site, doing most of the work for you. This class will cover Wordpress, a popular content management system and web hosting service. (Computer and Internet Basics recommended)

Board Games Gone Mobile - Tuesday, October 17th at 11:00 am - Feeling adventurous? Can't find anyone to play your favorite board games? During this session, we will explore the many board games that have been reconstituted as mobile apps and can be downloaded for free on your favorite devices. Bring Google or App Store login information

Create Your Own eNewsletter - Thursday, October 19th at 2:00 pm - This session will explore Canva, a free online design site that allows you to create your own eNewsletter. We will experiment with some of the editing options available. Canva does not provide for distribution. (Computer and Internet Basics recommended.)

Mobile Photos - Tuesday, October 24th at 11:00 am - Learn how to take digital photos using your smartphone or tablet. This class will also cover basic editing tools included on your device. (Android or iPad/iPhone recommended.)

How Do You Youtube - Thursday, October 26th at 2:00 pm - Do you actively use YouTube? Have you ever wondered how it might be possible to upload your own videos to share with others? This class will cover the basics on creating a video using a mobile device, and uploading it to the popular, online video platform. (Computer and Internet Basics recommended.)

On Monday, December 4th at 4 pm, Kentucky author Angela Correll will be presenting the final installment of her May Hollow trilogy, "Granted".

Angela Correll lives on a farm in Stanford with her husband, Jess. Her novels are Amazon bestsellers and have been adapted to the stage for sold-out audiences at the Pioneer Playhouse, Kentucky's oldest outdoor theater.

Angela created a business selling goat milk soap called Kentucky Soaps & Such that now operates as a soap-making factory and retail shop on Main Street in Stanford. She is also the concept designer for the Wilderness Road Guest Houses & Rooms, providing modern hospitality in an historic setting, and she and Jess are co-owners of the Bluebird Café, a farm-to-table restaurant, with Executive Chef William Hawkins.

She loves canning vegetables from her garden, exploring the Tuscan countryside, and spending time with her family.



Pee Wee Reese, Baseball Great

Dick Usher, a Chautauqua speaker, will be presenting "Pee Wee Reese, Baseball Great" on Thursday, January 25th at 5 pm. The program is sponsored by the Kentucky Humanities Council, Inc. This is something baseball fans and non-fans alike should enjoy!

"Harold Henry Reese got his famous nickname Pee Wee from a marble he used when he was a boy. The name fit because he turned out to be a man of modest stature, but by every measure you could apply to an athlete — teamwork, leadership, determination, winning, grace under pressure — Pee Wee Reese was a giant. Born in Meade County, Kentucky, Reese grew up in Louisville. At 19, he quit his job at the telephone company to play professional baseball for the Louisville Colonels. By 1940, he was playing for the Brooklyn Dodgers. As captain, shortstop, and lead-off man, he led the Dodgers to seven pennants and, in 1955, a World Series win. Inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1984, his plaque there also records the powerful example he set when Jackie Robinson joined the Dodgers in 1947 as the major leagues' first black player. Reese's acceptance and support of Robinson were instrumental in breaking down baseball's color barrier."
